

Weatherization Assistance Program *At-A-Glance*



The Weatherization Assistance Program (WAP) helps reduce energy costs for low-income households by improving the energy efficiency of their homes—while also protecting the health and safety of residents. On average, weatherized homes save \$283 or more each year through energy upgrades.

How the Program Works

The Weatherization process happens in four steps:

1. Apply
2. Energy Audit
3. Crew Completes Weatherization Work
4. Final Inspection

How to Apply

To determine eligibility, you must complete an application and provide all the following required documents:

- Signed and dated application
- Copy of the applicant's Social Security card
- Income documentation for all adults (19+) in the home for the past three months
- Proof of home ownership or landlord agreement
- Utility statements showing current utility service

Applications cannot be processed unless all documents are submitted.
Please ensure we have your current contact information.

Additional Program Details

- You must be living in the home, and it cannot be under construction.
- Both renters and homeowners may qualify.
- The program has a waitlist — you will be added only after submitting a complete application and receiving an approval letter.
- No-Heat Season (November 1–March 31): Households without heat are prioritized during this period.
